A message from our Chair and President & CEO

Excellence Together

Setting new records; setting new standards

The 2022/2023 fiscal year will forever stand out as a year of milestones and remarkable progress for the Health Sciences Centre Foundation. It was truly a monumental year.

We generated \$30.9 million in revenue, a staggering number and a new record for us. This total includes record revenues for the Innovation HSC Radiothon and our signature event—Savour: Wine & Food Experience. How wonderful it was to gather again in-person at Savour! We partied, we danced, and—most important—we rallied together as a community to raise \$938,000, including roughly \$400,000 to support the acquisition of new, leading-edge spine surgery equipment.

But the greatest source of our increased revenues was the phenomenal level of support we saw (and are continuing to see) for Operation Excellence, the largest campaign in our history. At the time of writing, we have raised over \$80 million, including a \$50 million commitment from the Province of Manitoba, toward

our \$100 million goal.

The campaign was conceived to improve patient care by refocusing HSC as a surgical centre of excellence and innovation through the acquisition of new, state-of-the-art, minimally invasive equipment; and the redevelopment of spaces to meet the emerging needs of HSC

and of Manitobans. Our goal has always been to reduce wait times for diagnostic tests and for surgeries, shorten hospital stays, and improve patient outcomes. Thanks to your ongoing generosity, we are starting to see evidence of success and we are so excited to achieve our goal in the coming months so that we can realize the full potential of this bold plan.

In the pages of this annual report, you will read about the highlights of the year and you will meet some members of the community who have demonstrated their support in remarkable ways. Year at a Glance: 2022/2023

The 2022–2023 fiscal year was a year like no other. We gathered together in person again, and we saw our donors step up like never before. Fuelled largely by the passionate support of our Operation Excellence campaign, the Foundation generated a record-setting \$30.9 million in revenue. With such monumental support, we are able to help the remarkable health care professionals at Manitoba's hospital set new standards in care and deliver on our vital and ambitious shared vision of providing tomorrow's health care, today.

Here are a few HSC Foundation highlights from 2022/2023:



On **June 22, 2022**, we made history by launching our largest ever capital campaign—the \$100 million **Operation Excellence** campaign to revitalize and refocus HSC as a surgical centre of excellence and innovation. The campaign is designed to acquire numerous pieces of leading-edge, minimally invasive diagnostic and surgical equipment; and fund the development of eight new operating rooms at HSC. At the time of publication, we have already raised over \$80 million, including a \$50 million contribution from the provincial government. See www.OperationExcellence.ca



On **June 9, 2022**, we formally unveiled the state-of-the-art **Paul Albrechtsen Interventional Radiology Suites.** This was a \$10.2 million initiative reflecting a partnership between government and philanthropy. Since opening, the suites—named in honour of the late Paul Albrechtsen, the largest supporter in the history of the HSC Foundation—have been fulfilling their promise of an enhanced patient experience, improved patient outcomes, and better conditions for the exceptional professionals who work in interventional radiology.



The **HSC Millionaire Lottery**, which sold out for the third year in a row in **November 2022**, generated net proceeds of \$2.31 million; the **Tri-Hospital Dream Lottery**, held in partnership with the Children's Hospital Foundation of Manitoba and the St. Boniface Hospital Foundation, generated \$879,000 in net revenue in support of HSC.

We rallied our community in support of our fourth annual **Innovation HSC** campaign. It launched in **September 2022**, surpassed its \$2.8 million goal on May 17, 2023, and raised over \$3 million. This campaign helps HSC acquire vital equipment to improve patient care.



Spearheaded by Board member Katie Hall Hursh, we successfully ran a short, focused campaign to upgrade **gynecological surgical equipment.** The campaign raised more than \$105,000 and the upgrades will ensure that optimal equipment is available for emergency gynecological surgery 24 hours a day.



Thanks to our generous donors and Board member Brian Lerner's matching gift challenge, we surpassed our \$100,000 fundraising goal to acquire an **ocular coherence tomograph machine**. The machine shortens the amount of time it takes to diagnose multiple sclerosis and allows for better tailoring of treatment strategies.



On **October 15, 2022**, we welcomed six new members to the **Bannatyne Legacy Circle**—a community of donors who have named the HSC Foundation as a beneficiary of their wills or have committed to another planned gift. The Bannatyne Legacy Circle Celebration (our first in-person event since the start of the pandemic) attracted 120 guests in person and 100 online. See page 16 for details.



Our 17th-annual **Innovation HSC Radiothon**, presented by
Maric Homes, took place on **January 20, 2023**, and raised
a record-breaking \$220,194 in

On **February 17, 2023**, we announced a \$1 million gift to the **Manitoba Urologic Centre** campaign from Exchange Income Corporation. This is the largest philanthropic gift ever made by EIC, and it will help ensure that all Manitobans—including First Nation, northern, and rural communities—receive better and more timely care.



Savour Ireland: Wine & Food Experience, presented by Jones & Company Wine Merchants, raised a Savour record of \$938,000 on **February 25, 2023**. See page 7 for more details.

In **March 2023**, we launched a \$500,000 campaign to develop four rooms between HSC's new Epilepsy Monitoring Unit and Manitoba's Provincial Acute Neurosurgery Unit. The new **Unit B5B** will meet the unique needs of both patient populations. Construction is nearing completion; the campaign is still underway.



Third-Party Events and Initiatives

Every year, the HSC Foundation is grateful to receive vital support from dedicated partners in our community. Businesses, community groups, and individuals rally behind our cause through special events and initiatives. This year, we proudly highlight the impactful partnership the HSC Foundation has with Bids for Benefit. 



Record-breaking \$938,000 Raised at Savour Ireland

Savour: Wine & Food Experience, presented by Jones & Company Wine Merchants, was back in full swing for its first in-person extravaganza since 2020.

On February 25, 2023, over 730 guests brought their generosity and inner Irish spirit to the RBC Convention Centre for the HSC Foundation's Savour Ireland: Wine & Food Experience.

A record-breaking total of over \$938,000 was raised, including \$400,000 for a suite of minimally invasive endoscopic spine surgery equipment through our Fund-A-Need auction. This equipment will allow surgeons to reduce the impact of spine surgery on patients and preserve as much of the patient's range of motion as possible.

Guests began the evening enjoying fine whisky, wine, and beer, sponsored by Manitoba Liquor Marts, Tasting Experience Partner.

Thanks to Entertainment Partner, TD Bank Group, The Specialists—a band that includes three HSC physicians—and the Big City All Star Band had guests dancing all night long.

Record-breaking \$220,194 Raised During Innovation HSC Radiothon


On January 20, 2023, the HSC Foundation raised a record-breaking \$220,194 during our 17th-annual Innovation HSC Radiothon, presented by Maric Homes.

From 6 AM to 6 PM, listeners tuned in to 680 CJOB, Power 97, and Peggy 99.1 to hear from grateful Manitoba patients who shared their health-care journeys, as well as doctors, researchers, and frontline health care providers who shared insights and innovations from HSC.

"Every donor who supported our Innovation HSC Radiothon will make a difference in the lives of thousands of Manitobans who rely on HSC every year," said Jonathon Lyon, President & CEO, HSC Foundation. "On behalf of our Board, staff, and volunteers, I want to thank everyone who contributed to the success of this event."

This year, Innovation HSC Radiothon donations included matching gifts from Access Credit Union, Arbor Memorial, Johnston Group, Manitoba pork producers, and The Wawanesa Mutual Insurance Company.

Money raised through the Radiothon enables the HSC Foundation to improve patient care at HSC through the acquisition of cutting-edge, minimally invasive medical equipment; the support of important research initiatives; and the development of new state-of-the-art facilities.

Ray Bouchard "We need to push the envelope."



"We are fortunate as Canadians that health care is afforded to everyone, but there are some limitations within the system," says Ray Bouchard, an HSC Foundation Board member since 2022.

As the President and CEO of Enns Brothers Ltd., an agricultural equipment dealer, Bouchard knows how important it is to invest in innovation "to stay on the front edge of the curve." For health care, he says, such progress requires "philanthropic capital".

"I really felt that we were missing opportunities in health care to adopt and introduce innovation," says Bouchard of his decision to join the Board of Directors. "We need to push the envelope in health care. There are new, less invasive, state-of-the-art technologies that are available. The challenge is how quickly we can acquire and introduce these technologies. I think this is where each and every one of us as Manitobans can play a role."

As a Board member, Bouchard says he has gained greater insights into what the public purse funds and what it doesn't, and he supports the Operation Excellence campaign as a way to raise the bar.

"We cannot achieve modernization, innovation, and health care excellence through traditional funding mechanisms alone," says Bouchard, a long-time Foundation donor along with his wife Debra. "Operation Excellence is exactly the type of bold action that we need to take to become leaders in the delivery of care for today and for generations to come. The campaign is allowing HSC to adopt innovative approaches to health care. It's going to allow HSC to pilot new tools and introduce new technologies to advance all departments and all areas of HSC. As Manitoba's hospital, HSC will touch the lives of all Manitobans. I would encourage everyone to support Operation Excellence."

Andrew and Krista Koop

The passion of a friend, the vision of a surgeon, and a sense of responsibility to the community inspired Krista and Andrew Koop to make a major gift to the HSC Foundation's Operation Excellence campaign.

"Our friend Tina Jones (Chair of the HSC Foundation Board of Directors) is absolutely driven by the importance of Operation Excellence," says Krista. "She introduced us to Dr. Ed Buchel (HSC's Surgery Site Director) and he made a compelling case for this campaign."

"His vision is huge, and it makes good sense," adds Andrew. "With the addition of new technology, people will have shorter hospital stays, which means beds can be freed up for the next people who need them. It's simply more efficient and there's a positive trickledown effect that will permeate throughout the health care system. We're contributing so that patients will have better outcomes and so that the system will have better outcomes. And the time to contribute is now; equipment will only get more expensive."



Above all, though, the Koops—owners of Irwin Homes—have made their Operation Excellence gift from a place of gratitude and from a place of communal responsibility.

"Winnipeg and Manitoba have been good to us, and we want to do our part to make sure everything here is excellent," says Andrew.

"We read the stories of patients and donors on the Foundation's website, and realize how vital HSC is for Manitobans," adds Krista. "Touch wood, we haven't had any major health challenges, but we know that HSC ultimately touches the lives of every family in the province."

Shirley and Richard Lawrence

"When we need HSC, it needs to be there."

Shirley Lawrence and her husband Richard—retired school teachers in Selkirk—have been donating regularly to the HSC Foundation for 34 years, including a gift to the Operation Excellence campaign in 2023.

The Lawrences have been giving for so long, in fact, that they don't recall what prompted that first gift in 1989. They've just always known that supporting HSC is the right thing to do.

"HSC is Manitoba's signature hospital and it needs to stay current with technology," says Shirley. "HSC is absolutely critical for Manitoba and we all need to contribute to keep improving it."

The Lawrences live a full and active life in retirement. They enjoy camping, hunting, and spending time at their cabin in their hometown of Eriksdale. They are good-humoured, active, and grateful for the care they and their family members have received at HSC over the years.

In 1994, Richard had subcutaneous lymphoma, a rare form of skin cancer. He required full-body radiation for several weeks. "It worked, but the treatment wiped out his sweat glands," says Shirley. Eight years ago, he had a recurrence. Instead of radiation,



this time he was able to be treated quickly and successfully with a nitrogen mustard cream. For Shirley, progress like this reinforces her commitment to supporting health care.

"When we need HSC, it needs to be there," she says. "And we need to support it, even when we're not sick because there will come a time when we'll all need it."

Winnipeg Kinsmen

"What touches us about this campaign is that we can make life easier for patients."

For the 22 volunteer members of the Winnipeg Kinsmen, membership is all about giving back to the community. With the service club's recent support of the HSC Foundation's Operation Excellence campaign, they are indeed giving back in a big way.

This new support follows a major donation to the HSC Foundation's COVID-19 Crisis Response Fund in 2020.

"COVID altered our giving," says Hiren Shah, Winnipeg Kinsmen's Vice President of Service. "Right now, coming out of the pandemic, one of our biggest areas of focus is addictions and mental health, and people needing help in those areas are better served when the entire health care system is strong."

The Winnipeg Kinsmen, formed in 1924, raise most of their funds through Kinsmen Jackpot Bingo (airing 5:30 p.m. every Saturday on CTV) and the Annual Kin Kar Raffle. They distribute millions of dollars a year to health care organizations, children's charities,

social services, art, education, and sports. Their support of the HSC Foundation is one of their many strong expressions of support for community well-being.

"HSC is a vital hub for the health care system for Manitoba and for Northwest Ontario. It covers a large area," says Shah. "I think one of the most important aspects of Operation Excellence is that with the new equipment patients who live far away from HSC don't have to come back multiple times for care. What touches us about this campaign is that we can make life easier for patients, their families, the surgeons, the nurses, and the whole system."



Joe and Karn Sandy "I give them my heart. They work so hard there."

Joe Sandy was sluggish and dehydrated in August 2022 when his wife Karn called a nurse they knew for advice.

"What's his blood pressure?," asked their friend.

"71 over 52," Karn replied.

"Call 911."

Karn nervously did as advised. With COVID restrictions still in place on some units, and with Joe being confused and hard of hearing, she was concerned that there could be glitches in his care if she couldn't be by his side.

Over the previous few months, Joe had taken ill twice, including a bout with COVID that had some lasting effects on his energy and breathing. He has one kidney, gastroenterological issues, atrial fibrillation, and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). Karn's greatest concerns were that Joe might get COVID again, and that he wouldn't be able to hear and understand the questions being asked of him.

"When I got to HSC's Emergency Department, I explained to them about the hearing problem and they took me almost immediately into a separate room," recalls Karn. "The doctor took a look at him and came to talk with me right away. I started to feel a little bit better and I could tell that they understood my concerns."

Joe wasn't transferred to a unit, where Karn would not have been



able to visit. Instead, staff found a way to keep him in his own space where Karn could stay and communicate on his behalf.

"I received the best care I've ever had. People cared," says Joe, now 85, holding back his tears. "I give them my heart. They work so hard there."

It turns out that Joe had an E. coli. He was treated and then discharged as soon as the infection was under control.

The Sandys have been regular contributors to the HSC Foundation, but decided to make a larger-than-usual gift—and share their story—as a way of expressing their gratitude.

A year has passed since the E. coli experience, and, despite his many health challenges, Joe is living a very full life socializing and exercising daily, and polishing his red '47 Mercury in preparation for the next vintage car show.

"He does all of the gardening and most of the housework," says Karn with a smile. "I just can't get him to cook!"

Liz Rootsaert

"It's how I was raised."



Growing up in Manila in the Philippines, Liz Rootsaert remembers seeing her parents living out the Filipino principle of "bayanihan"—a spirit of community unity and a desire to come together to help people in need.

"We were poor when I was growing up," says Rootsaert, an Executive Assistant at the HSC Foundation. "To earn more money, my mom would

cook noodles and desserts and sell them in front of our house. Almost every day someone would come by and ask for free food because they had even less money than we did. My parents always said 'yes' when it came to helping others. It's how I was raised."

Rootsaert, a former Microsoft implementation project manager, moved to Winnipeg in 2006 two years after meeting the man who

was to become her husband. "We met online talking about tech," she laughs. "We're both geeks!"

After her stint with Microsoft Canada ended in 2015 due to global layoffs, Rootsaert joined the HSC Foundation staff to support the executive team and serve as the organization's in-house tech maven. From her unique vantage point, she very quickly learned how important HSC is to health care in Manitoba, and how important philanthropy is to HSC. Driven by that same spirit of bayanihan that shaped her upbringing, Rootsaert became a proud donor, and recently made a gift to HSC's Operation Excellence campaign. In fact, 100% of the HSC Foundation's 22 staff members are donors to the organization through the annual Your Charity at Work campaign.

"We have such amazing people at the hospital," she says. "With donations, we can make sure they have the equipment they need to do their best work. And when we have the best equipment we can attract more people to work here."

Fund-A-Need Donors

"Our donors make progress possible."

HSC's spine surgeons and other donors rallied together in February 2023 to fund a suite of new, minimally invasive equipment to improve outcomes for patients receiving endoscopic spine surgery.

Through the annual Fund-A-Need Auction—held in conjunction with Savour: Wine & Food Experience, presented by Jones & Company Wine Merchants—donors contributed \$400,000 to the cause. Of that, HSC's spine surgeons contributed \$150,000.

In most spine surgeries, the surgeon must take pressure off of the patient's spine or the nerves to preserve or restore mobility and to decrease pain. With conventional equipment, the challenge is to do this without destabilizing the spine by carving away too much bone and ligament.

The new, minimally invasive equipment will allow HSC's spine surgeons to reduce the impact of spine surgery on normal anatomy and preserve as much of the patient's range of motion as possible.

Among other features, the equipment includes narrow scopes with flexible tips that will allow surgeons to work around healthy structures (instead of carving them away) to get to the targeted area.



With 360-degree cameras on the ends of the scopes, the surgeons' work will be visible on high-definition monitors. This means smaller incisions are required, which reduces pain and the risk of complications after surgery. In many cases, the patient can be wide awake during the procedure and they can go home—pain-free—the same day.

"This is truly remarkable and revolutionary technology that will help our surgeons preserve and restore mobility, and improve patients' quality of life," says Annette Frost, Chief Development Officer at the HSC Foundation. "We are moved by how quickly and enthusiastically people rallied to support this initiative. Our donors make progress possible."

150 Years Together dition of progress and excellence onouring

This year, HSC Winnipeg marks 150 years of serving the community, thanks in large part to donors like you. Health Sciences Centre's history begins with the establishment of the Winnipeg General Hospital in 1872. In 1973, the Winnipeg General Hospital merged with Children's Hospital of Winnipeg and The Manitoba Rehabilitation Hospital-D.A. Stewart Centre (Respiratory Hospital) and became HSC Winnipeg.

We honour the visionary donors, leaders, and medical professionals who established HSC and its founding institutions. And we recognize the generations of supporters and health care personnel who have always championed excellence in patient care. 🔷



Research Grants

New knowledge, better outcomes

In the fall of 2022, the Health Sciences Centre Foundation provided researchers with over **\$470,000** in research grants, helping fund eight projects at HSC. This research has the power to transform patient care by enhancing the knowledge of our medical teams—ultimately leading to better diagnoses and treatment methods. We thank our donors for investing in research to move health care forward.

RESEARCHER SPOTLIGHT: Dr. Asher Mendelson

Developing the tools to understand ICU-acquired weakness

Dr. Asher Mendelson is dedicated to preventing intensive care unit (ICU)—acquired weakness, a condition that affects up to 80 percent of ICU patients and can lead to long-term health issues. Before Dr. Mendelson and his team can tackle that challenge, they need to focus on developing a more accurate diagnostic and testing method.

"One of the first things we realized was that to test these patients effectively after recovery from the ICU, we have to develop better exercise research tools," says Dr. Mendelson. "We've spent the last several months designing those new protocols that we've been testing on healthy volunteers, and we're optimistic."

While optimizing their tools and protocols, Dr. Mendelson and his team are actively screening ICU patients who will participate in their research once the initial tests on healthy volunteers are complete. Expected recruitment of ICU patients will begin in the fall of 2023.

"Over the last five months we've worked with 25 of these healthy participants, and we've come up with a novel exercise protocol that hasn't been described before," he says. "We can't expect vulnerable people to come back to HSC multiple times for testing, so part of our research was to develop the process to get the same amount of information with a single visit." Dr. Mendelson and his team are currently writing up their findings with healthy participants for publication.

This grant has not only helped advance the understanding of ICU-acquired weakness, it has also allowed Dr. Mendelson and his team to apply for grants to purchase cutting-edge research equipment. A proposed exercise research facility, located on the HSC campus, would address the scarcity of exercise research equipment on campus and the unmet need to evaluate exercise capacity in ICU survivors.

"There is not enough exercise research equipment on the HSC campus, and what we have is mostly focused on pediatric and spinal cord rehab populations; there isn't any access for adult ICU patients...so we are hoping to change that," says Dr. Mendelson.

"The exercise research facility would also allow for more research teams at HSC to conduct their experiments. This HSC Foundation grant has provided support for research personnel and, overall, it's been a very positive first year of our study." \diamondsuit

Virtual care and the future of medicine

At the risk of sounding inhospitable, we want to provide the best care possible at HSC, but we want you to go home as soon as possible. There is growing international evidence that at a certain point in many patients' recoveries from surgery or illness, healing at home with effective monitoring is better and safer than a prolonged stay in a hospital bed.

At home, you can open a window, pet your dog, have breakfast with a loved one, read your books, wear your own clothes, and sleep in your own bed. It's simply better for most people's mental and physical health to be in their own home once they are through the most intensive stages of their health care journey.

Thanks to the generous support of donors to the HSC Foundation's Operation Excellence campaign and other initiatives, we are making remarkable strides in shortening hospital stays by offering minimally invasive surgeries that see some patients treated and discharged in a matter of hours, not days.

Another key, emerging phenomenon that is helping hospitals shorten hospital stays and provide more comprehensive care is "virtual care". In essence, virtual care is the idea of keeping meaningful and substantive contact with a patient while they recover in the comfort of their own home. It is not a replacement for conventional care; it's a powerful enhancement. For some patients, it means three or four daily connections by video chat or phone calls with doctors or nurses. It could also mean monitoring your own oxygen saturation and blood pressure at home, with the support of a nurse on the screen in front of you.

As it evolves, virtual care will also be a vital lifeline for patients who live far from HSC. If you live in Gillam, for example, wouldn't it be better to follow up with your surgeon by video than driving 11 and a half hours (each way) or staying in hospital a week longer than necessary? It is important to get people back to their home communities as soon as they are safely ready for discharge. Effective remote monitoring—potentially supported by our increasingly powerful and versatile smartphones—makes this possible.

HSC and hospitals all over the world have been dipping a toe in the virtual care waters for quite a while. In fact, now that so many hospitals have tested it successfully, I would say there is no turning back. Through COVID-19, our mental health leaders broke new ground and saw remarkable results with a Virtual Ward program where mental health patients received care and counselling online. Also through the pandemic, we launched the highly successful, donor-funded Virtual COVID-19 Outpatient Program that allowed for the discharge of stable COVID patients, while beds were freed up for others who needed them. These programs are proof of concept.

Virtual care works, not for all patients, and not in all circumstances, but it is a critical solution for health care challenges faced the world over. Like all hospitals, we are preparing for the expansion of virtual care. The business case is solid—less travel required, thousands of dollars per patient saved in hospital time, shorter queues for the next patients who need beds, and other efficiencies. More important, there is mounting empirical and anecdotal evidence that, for many patients, virtual care is the better path to recovery.

Home is where you're whole, so home is where you heal. Technology, innovation, focus, and your support will help us develop and nurture a robust virtual care infrastructure for all Manitobans. 🔷
